

Home and Heritage

Ravenswood Post Office

After the discovery of gold in 1868 through to the early 1900s, Ravenswood became a town associated with major gold mining in North Queensland that gave significant impetus to the economic and social development of the region. The state's encouragement for such growth was demonstrated by establishment of public infrastructure such as post offices. Postal services were vital in the establishment of towns, particularly when they also had important economic resources.



The Department of Works built a post and telegraph station in 1873 in Ravenswood and replaced it with the existing post office built in 1885 by the Queensland Public Works Department. The Ravenswood Post Office was added to the Queensland Heritage Register on 21 October 1992. With a distinctive classical pediment over the front entrance, the building has been used continuously since construction. As an important public building, its position on the corner of Raven and Macrossan Streets makes it a significant feature in the townscape of Ravenswood.

Throughout Ravenswood's ups and downs, it has continued to provide some government and business services to the surrounding community. It now runs as a small mixed business selling groceries, fuel, ice and other small items, in conjunction with the postal services. It truly is a convenient store for the local community and visitors.

Barb Srhoj and Beth Flemming from NQ RAFS are coming to Ravenswood to run a playgroup with children from birth to 8yrs.


